Who we are



We provide consultation and pharmacological review for clients with severe mental illness who are *at risk for*, or currently experiencing metabolic disturbances such as:

- weight gain (related to treatments, or lifestyle factors)
- prediabetes/ diabetes
- hyperlipidemia
- hypertension
- concerns about metabolic side-effects when starting psychotropic medication

Short-term follow-up is provided if needed, on case-by case basis

The Mental Health and Metabolism Clinic is staffed by three psychiatrists and a hospitalist, with unique expertise in helping individuals at risk for cardio-metabolic problems who also suffer from mental illness.

We employ a multi-pronged strategy to address metabolic comorbidities and work with our clients and their care service providers to promote healthier lifestyle

Who we serve

Services are available to both in-patients and outpatients of CAMH. Referrals from the community at large are also accepted.

All services are confidential and covered by OHIP.

What we offer:

- 1) Consultation around choosing and optimizing psychotropic medication to minimize metabolic adverse effects
- 2) Guidance around metabolic monitoring
- 3) Cutting edge pharmacological strategies to address cardiometabolic risk (weight-reducing, anti-diabetes, anti-lipid, blood pressure medications)
- 4) Lifestyle interventions
- 5) Connecting clients and care-providers with appropriate community resources
- 6) Opportunities to participate in innovative research
- 7) Advocacy to enhance knowledge around mental and physical health

• We do not offer primary psychiatric care, and work in collaboration with treating psychiatrist or family practitioner

How to make a referral:

For CAMH clients, using icare:

- 1) Go under "Orders add"
- 2) Type in "metabolism"
- 3) Select: "referral to metabolism clinic", then "done"
- 4) In free text field, type in referral reason (e.g. weight gain, metabolic syndrome, medication review, etc.)
